





FROM THE APRIM


Next Tuesday, September 21st is the Feast of Saint Matthew. Little is known about St Matthew, except that he was likely born in Galilee. He worked as a tax collector, which was a hated profession during the time of Christ. According to the Gospel, Matthew was working at a collection booth in Capernaum when Christ came to him and asked, "Follow me." Matthew answered the call and became a disciple of Christ.


From Matthew we know about the Life, Miracle Stories and Teachings of Christ through his Gospel. His book is the first of the four Gospels in the New Testament, written in around 41AD. He wrote the book in Aramaic in the hope that his account would convince his fellow people that Jesus was the Messiah and that His kingdom had been fulfilled in a spiritual way.

It is thought he departed for other lands to escape persecution sometime after 42 AD. According to various legends he fled to Parthia and Persia, or Ethiopia. Nothing is recorded of Matthew's passing. We do not know how he died, if his death was natural or if he was martyred. Matthew was a tax collector and is therefore the patron saint of bankers.

The Bible and I
Prayers in the Bible 10 *(continued)*

The Prayer of the Prophet Jeremiah - an Inadequate Youth (Jeremiah 1:6)

God announced to Jeremiah that he was His chosen prophet to address nations (v. 5). From the chronological data of verses 2 and 3 we learn that the years of his prophecy were from 627 B.C. to 586 B.C., forty-two years of proclaiming dreadful judgment on a hardened people.

NJB **Jeremiah 1:4-10** ⁴ The word of Yahweh came to me, saying: ⁵ 'Before I formed you in the womb I knew you; before you came to birth I consecrated you; I appointed you as prophet to the nations.' ⁶ I then said, 'Ah, ah, ah, Lord Yahweh; you see, I do not know how to speak: I am only a child!' ⁷ But Yahweh replied, 'Do not say, "I am only a child," for you must go to all to whom I send you and say whatever I command you. ⁸ Do not be afraid of confronting them, for I am with you to rescue you, Yahweh declares.' ⁹ Then Yahweh stretched out his hand and touched my mouth, and Yahweh said to me: 'There! I have put my words into your mouth. ¹⁰ Look, today I have set you over the nations and kingdoms, to uproot and to knock down, to destroy and to overthrow, to build and to plant.'

- 1) They would not listen to his call for repentance;
- 2) They disbelieved his warning that God was going to permit pagan Babylon to pull down the temple of Yahweh.
- 3) They hated him for even uttering God's message of doom. King Nebuchednezzar of Babylon besieged Jerusalem, sacked it in 586 BC and exiled the Jews to Babylon.

Jeremiah lived in an age when the elderly were respected and when young people kept silent in their presence. So Jeremiah, who must have been a young man at the time, might well be overwhelmed at the prospect of such a ministry. Plainly, Jeremiah sensed his own inadequacy as he faced the mission which God had called him to perform.

In verse 6, Jeremiah's prayer disclaims both:

- 1) His ability, "I cannot speak";
- 2) His person, "I am a youth";

God's reply contains several lessons. (vv. 7-10).

- 1) *Don't make excuses (when I, God, call you). 2) I shall go with you (I am wiser, stronger than they). 3) You shall be speaking My words (I always speak truth). 4) Do not fear them (I, God, can and will deliver you). 5) Your authority comes from Me (I rule over nations and kingdoms).*
- 2) *We share with Jeremiah this sense of personal insufficiency. So we join him in voicing our own prayer of inadequacy. Lord have mercy! (compiled by Fr Francis)*

FOR YOUR INFORMATION

School routines:

- **SCHOOL START** - School starts at 8.50am, children must be under supervision of adults at all times. Yard Duty begins at 8.30am, if they arrive earlier they need to attend OSHC;
- **LATE ARRIVALS** - If your child is later than 8.50am they **must** sign in at Student Reception;
- **SCHOOL FINISH** - School finishes at 3pm if you **cannot** collect your child by 3.10pm, they need to go to OSHC;
- **PICK UP/DROP OFF SAFETY** - Please use the Kiss and Drop Zone and **DO NOT** drop off your children in the car parks or park in Disabled Zones ... it is illegal;
- **SAFETY** - Please don't walk on the driveways, use the footpaths, don't walk in or out of the vehicle entry/exit gates;
- **LABELLING** - please label all removable clothing (ie. jumpers, jackets, hats), label school bags, drink bottles, lunch boxes and anything else your child may bring;
- **PERSONAL ITEMS** - No toys, electronics or sports equipment to be brought to school (laptops available for lease Years R-1 and provided for Years 2-6, sports equipment available from class teacher);
- **NUT FREE** - A reminder we are a **nut free** school. This includes but is not limited to Nutella, Peanut Butter and some muesli bars.
- **STAFF CAR PARK** - The inside carpark is for STAFF only.
- **GATES** - All gates are locked everyday at 9.15am and re-opened at 2.15pm. During these times you must come through the front office and sign in.

Laptops

The laptops are a great tool for the students. Here are a few tips for looking after them:

- No food or drink near the laptop;
- Store in a safe and dry area;
- Use in a dry area (ie not near sinks or wash areas);
- Do not run or walk with the laptop in the open position;
- Do not run with the laptop;
- Always ensure the protective cover is on and not tampered with.
